

# FOX PARK OBSERVATORY - SOLAR OBSERVING **PROGRAM**

Sunday, March 29 – Saturday, April 25 - Sunday May 17 - Sunday, June 28

Eaton County Parks invites everyone to come out to the Fox Park Public Observatory and view our closest star the Sun. Participants will have the opportunity to safely observe the Sun's surface, spying spots and solar flares, using solar filters from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Fox Park Public Observatory.

**SOLAR VIEWING CAUTION:** Extreme caution must be taken when attempting to observe the Sun. Staring at the Sun with the unprotected eye can quickly cause serious eye damage. Never look directly at the Sun with your naked eve or unfiltered telescope permanent eye damage may occur.

The Observatory, located at 3979 Gresham Hwy., Potterville, MI 48876, is an open air facility so please dress appropriately for the weather, bring mosquito protection, and wear sturdy footwear for the 200 yard walk to the Observatory.

Program fee is \$2 per person or \$5 per family payable on site.

#### Can We Participate?

Up to 24 worksites may participate in the 2015 Healthy Worksite program. The program is open to any worksite in Barry or Eaton County in which at least 25% of workers make less than \$30,500 per year (or \$14.66 per hour). Worksites must have at least five workers. Private offices, restaurants, childcare centers, or retail establishments are examples of worksites that may be interested in the Healthy Worksite program.

#### How Does It Work?

- 1. Each site forms a team of 2-5 people
- Your team will meet with a Health Educator or community change partner to complete the assessment (CHANGE tool\*\*) which takes 1-1 %
- Develop a feasible and low cost action plan focused on a health policy or environmental change to support healthy eating or physical activity.
- Execute the plan and evaluate the difference it's making.
- 5. Request reimbursement up to \$500.00 per site.

\*\* CHANGE is a data-collection tool that allows worksites to track progress across a five-point scale, so incremental changes can be noted. As problem areas are identified, health-related policies are implemented, and systems and environmental change strategies are put in place, team members can document the change.
