

Island Park Erosion Project – from Mayor Kalmin Smith

About 15 years ago, the City with significant support from the Chamber of Commerce and many volunteers, initiated a major project to stop or slow erosion at Island Park, make significant improvements to the park, and erect a safe and solid pedestrian bridge to the island.

Since that time, observant residents have noticed that the island is considerably narrower as we have lost sizable amounts of river bank on the island and erosion continues in the areas not previously stabilized.

This summer the City is attempting to address the continued erosion problem. A temporary draw down of the river began on Monday 30 June under a project permitted by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). While the river is down, the City will be conducting bank restoration on the south side of the island. This will be done by excavating a trench along the bank, installing a geotextile barrier, and filling it with limestone rip rap. This is the best and most economical way we have found to keep the island in place.

The permit from the DEQ requires that the river be back to its normal level on 1 September. It takes about a week to lower the river and another week to raise it. The project should be completed in three weeks. The intention (which is not a guarantee) is to have the river back up by the Island Art Fair. While the river is down, City engineers will also be flow testing the underside of the dam to determine if water is flowing beneath the dam structure. This information is important as discussions about the economic, environmental and social consequences of various options regarding the future of the dam are considered.

Many patrons in years past have brought their lawn chairs to the authors reading and then carried them across the lot to the grassy plaza.




