John Two-Hawks LIVE in Concert

John Two-Hawks is a GRAMMY® and Emmy nominated, Platinum Award Winning Native American Flute Music recording artist whose music has been featured in movies by Fox Searchlight, films by HBO, and programs by The History Channel.

Two-Hawks is a bona fide World, New Age, Alternative and Native Flute Music visionary and pioneer who has pressed the envelope and pushed the boundaries of musical genres for decades.

From collaborating on platinum selling music fusion projects which melded indigenous music with symphonic heavy metal, to contributing his music on Emmy award winning film scores which teamed Native American flute, vocals and percussion with symphony orchestras and choirs, John has always challenged the limits of what is possible in music composition and performance.

John is an international touring artist who has performed for audiences as large as 12,000. A remarkably gifted multi-instrumentalist, incredible vocalist and native flute virtuoso, Two-Hawks' signature brand of World Fusion, New Age, Native and Alternative music is known and loved by millions around the world.

Since John's last visit to the Grand Ledge Opera House, he did another international concert tour, with shows in Ireland, Norway and Sweden. He has applied his musical gift to scoring film, a new endeavor he is enjoying immensely. John has also developed a curriculum for teaching 'mindfulness' from an indigenous perspective. Two-Hawks has also just begun a musical collaboration with angelic Finnish singer Johanna

Kurkela. Together, they will create a beautiful new music experience which blends Johanna's heavenly voice with John's own harmonic vocals and enchanting Native flutes and symphonic musical compositions. On a more cultural note, this past December John was invited to participate in the 'Big Foot Memorial Ride', a grueling 135 mile ride on horseback in which the Lakota people pay homage to the Wounded Knee massacre which happened on December 29th, 1890. The ride takes place in the middle of December in South Dakota, starting in Standing Rock Indian Reservation, and ending at Wounded Knee and Pine Ridge district on the Pine Ridge Reservation. John was honored to make this deeply painful, sacrificial journey with his people, a journey which both remembers the past and looks into the future. Stemming from this experience is John's next album - his 24th - 'Horse Spirit', to be released later this year. A new music video DVD collection is also in the works!




